Principle	Considerations
Context	What historical contexts—within the community, society, and broader political or economic systems—shape the foundation and implications of this research?
Listening	Whose voice is in the room? Whose voice is missing?
Flexibility	How can we remain adaptable to accommodate the shifting needs/priorities of our partner?
Co-Creation	How can we ensure the organization/community is positioned as equal decision-making partners and co-leaders through every stage of the research process?
Trauma-Informed	How can we proactively mitigate harm and distress during the survey-taking process?
Transparency	Have we articulated what we expect, and are those expectations fair and reasonable?
Addressing Bias	How might my conscious or unconscious biases influence how I approach and navigate this work?
Accessibility	How can we meet the respondents where they are in their lives at this moment?
Asset-Focused	How can we honor and leverage existing networks that are doing this work?
Centering Marginalized Voices	How will our analysis plan center the communities affected most by this topic?
Capacity Bridging	What support can we offer to translate knowledge into action?
Shared Ownership	How do we ensure data is mutually beneficial and not extractive?
Co-Learning	How can we work in tandem with our partner to integrate and prioritize their data interpretations?
